

Dominican Republic closes all borders with Haiti as tensions rise

•The situation in Haiti is dire, and getting worse every day

 New donor support has been challenging, as many want to understandably "go and see", and the current environment makes traveling to Haiti extremely difficult

• The cost of the work continues to rise, as do opportunities to spread the Gospel

 Because of ESMI's long standing, effective use of in country personnel, we are uniquely poised to further Christ's message throughout the country

 Key opportunities include Pastoral Training & Support, Food Supplies, Good News Broadcasts (via radio), and Worship Gatherings



What's Been Happening

- No real working government. Many NGO's leaving the country, creating a greater void.
- Gangs have been estimated to control approximately 60% of Port-au-Prince.
- Gangs also control ports, major roadways, and gas supply – food & gas up 70+% (as high as \$50/gal). Economic activity has significantly slowed.
- Country has asked for intervention from UN
- Sanctions against senators & former president
- Thousands moving from Port-au-Prince to outer provinces, impacting all ESMI communities.





What God Has Done

- •200+ Churches across all of Haiti shepherding 45,000+ people
- 9,500+ children in education programs with well above average national test pass rates
- •350+ pastors in training
- Thousands of Bibles distributed annually, audio and in print
- •Near nationwide radio ministry reaching over 3.5 million people
- •Health clinics reaching 2,000+ people every month with quality care




God Is Still At Work

- •9 new churches planted in 2023
- School attendance remains high near 100% pass rate of primary / secondary exams
- Church attendance growing across the country
- •Over 4,000 people attended national convention
- Over 2,500 Salvations so far this year
- Technology allowing programming to reach Haiti through the radio and web



The Adjustments We've Made

- Focused unrestricted funds to support drastic price increases
- Used reserves to help maintain key areas of ministry
- Structural growth efforts put on hold while Spiritual Growth is many ways greater than it has ever been
- While some new donations have helped, current needs are increasing, with many people coming from Port-au-Prince to ESMI communities





Pastoral Leadership Training

Bringing pastors to safe locations to receive the training they need to continue to feed the spiritual growth of their growing congregations - \$25,000 / year

Pastoral Support

While many pastors were able to supplement their family needs with other vocational work, business costs have risen to make either their small business close or eliminate their part time work. Every 10 pastors can be supported for \$6,000 / year

• Food Supplies

Many of the ESMI churches look to provide food for those in their congregation most in need. \$8,000 buys a container of food, providing over 300,000 meals





• <u>Good News Broadcasts (Radio)</u> <u>Ministry</u>

While all the equipment is in place, continued operations of the station are \$30,000 / year. Advertising opportunities have been severely limited due to the current situation – yet we have an unprecedented opportunity as Haitians seek Hope in the current environment.



Annual Worship Convention

Attracting many seeking Faith as well as growing Christians, this gathering now has over 4,000 people in attendance each year from all across Haiti. The four day event provides a time of reflection, renewal, and rejoicing, brining hundreds to Christ every year. As more have come, our cost have increased to nearly \$35,000.







About Haiti:


- Speak Haitian Kreyòl
